To protect public health and slow the rate of transmission of COVID-19, the California Department of Public Health has issued guidance **asking for all non-essential mass gatherings of 250 persons or more to be postponed or canceled**. These gatherings should be postponed or canceled across the state of California for at least the remainder of the month of March.

A “gathering” is any event or convening that brings together people in a single room or single space at the same time, such as an auditorium, stadium, arena, large conference room, meeting hall, cafeteria, or any other indoor or outdoor space.

While this guidance does not apply to activities such as attendance at regular school classes, it does apply to school sporting events, and should be taken into consideration for assemblies, meetings, and other in-school gatherings.
